What Are Adverbs of Place?

- Adverbs of place tell **where** an action happens.
- They show the **location, direction, or position** of an activity or event.
- They usually answer the question **"Where?"**

Common Adverbs of Place Table

Type	Examples	Example Sentence
Location	here, there, inside, outside	She is waiting outside .
Direction	up, down, away, back, forward	He walked down the hill.
Distance	nearby, far, close, anywhere	The school is nearby .
Position	above, below, under, behind, in front	The books are above the shelf.

Example:

- The children are playing outside.
- He looked up at the sky.
- Please sit here.
- The cat is hiding under the table.

Remember

- Adverbs of place answer where the action happens.
- They usually come after the main verb or object.
- They do not take prepositions before them.
 🚫 Incorrect: Go to outside. ✅ Correct: Go outside.
- Many adverbs of place also show movement or direction (away, back, up, down).
