What is a Noun?

A noun is a word that names a person, place, animal, or thing.

Example: Riya, dog, school, apple

Types of Nouns and Examples

Type of Noun	Definition	Examples	Explanation
Common Noun	The general name of any person, place, or thing.	boy, city, pen, teacher	Names used for all people or things of the same kind.
Proper Noun	The special name of a particular person, place, or thing.	Riya, Delhi, Monday, Taj Mahal	Always begins with a capital letter.
Collective Noun	The name of a group of people, animals, or things.	team, bunch, herd, family	Shows a group or collection.
Abstract Noun	The name of a feeling, idea, or quality.	honesty, love, happiness, anger	Something we can think of but cannot see or touch.
Material Noun	The name of a substance or material things are made of.	gold, water, wood, cotton	Materials or elements used to make other things.

Extra Types for Higher Classes

Type	Definition	Examples
Countable Nouns	Things that can be counted.	apple, book, car
Uncountable Nouns	Things that cannot be counted.	milk, air, rice
Concrete Nouns	Things we can see or touch.	table, flower, cat

- A noun is the name of **anything around us**.
- Every sentence has at least **one noun**.
- Proper nouns always start with a **capital letter**.

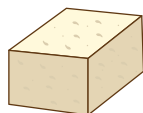
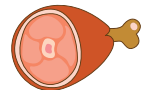
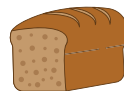
