

What Is an Adverb? (Concept Overview)

 An adverb is a word that gives more information about a verb, adjective, or another adverb. It tells how, when, where, or how often something happens.

Examples

- She sings **beautifully**. (tells how)
- He arrived **early**. (tells when)
- The dog ran **outside**. (tells where)
- They visit us often. (tells how often)

Type of Adverb

Type of Adverb	Examples & Meaning
Adverbs of Manner (How)	quickly, slowly, carefully, beautifully
Adverbs of Place (Where)	here, there, outside, upstairs
Adverbs of Time (When)	today, yesterday, soon, always
Adverbs of Frequency (How Often)	often, never, always, sometimes
Adverbs of Degree (How Much)	very, quite, almost, too

Remember

- Most adverbs end with "ly" but not all (e.g., fast, well).
- Adverbs tell us how, when, where, or how often something happens.
- They modify verbs, adjectives, or other adverbs, not nouns.
- Don't confuse adjectives and adverbs:
 - Adjective → She is quick.
 - Adverb → She runs quickly.
- Some adverbs can change position in a sentence, but meaning should remain clear.




