What is a Relative Pronoun?

- A **Relative Pronoun** is a word that joins two sentences or gives more information about a noun in a sentence.
- It connects a main clause with a relative clause (the part that describes the noun).

Common Relative Pronouns: ➡ who ➡ whom ➡ whose ➡ which ➡ that

Why Do We Use Them?

- To describe a **person, place, or thing** more clearly.
- To **avoid repetition** in sentences.
- To **connect** ideas smoothly.

Relative Pronouns Table

Relative Pronoun	Used For	Example Sentence
who	Refers to a <i>person</i> (subject)	The boy who won the race is my friend.
whom	Refers to a <i>person</i> (object)	The girl whom you met is my cousin.
whose	Shows <i>possession</i>	The man whose car was stolen called the police.
which	Refers to <i>things or animals</i>	This is the pen which I bought yesterday.
that	Refers to <i>people, animals, or things</i> (general use)	The book that you gave me is interesting.

Quick Tips to Remember

- **Who / Whom** → for people
- **Whose** → shows ownership
- **Which** → for objects or animals
- **That** → for anything (people + things + animals)

Never use commas with "that," but use commas with "who/which" when giving extra info.
