Word	Usage	Example
These	These is used to refer to multiple things that are close to the speaker.	These are my shoes. (The shoes are near me.)
Those	Those is used to refer to multiple things that are farther away from the speaker.	Those are your books. (The books are far from me.)

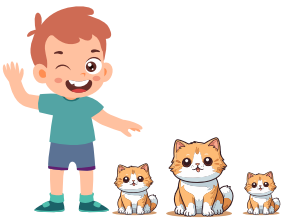

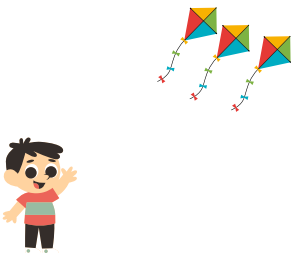
